A variety of crises challenge individuals and societies in a special way today - the list is so well known that there is already talk of crisis fatigue. How can education and research deal with these crises in such a way that those involved experience empowerment? This concept is central to the writings of Paulo Freire and gains particular relevance in light of current experiences of powerlessness.

Why?

The symposium aims to provide space for exchange on experiences of empowerment in education and research in the context of multiple crises - especially with regard to addressing concepts of emancipatory pedagogy. Reflections and experiences from the Global South will enrich the exchange and self-reflection of the participants.

For whom?

- Education workers and people who advocate for education in various fields and forms
- Activists from different fields, trying to support empowering the oppressed
- Students and scholars ("thinkers") of different origins/disciplines and different "phases" - especially if they relate/reply to Freire's pedagogy in their work (e.g. theses)
- Interested people, who want to get in touch with Paulo Freire and his liberation pedagogy

Walter Omar **Kohan** is Professor of Education at the Philosophy of State University of Rio de Janeiro (Brazil), where he studies theoretically and practically the relationships between childhood, education and philosophy. As a profound connoisseur of Paulo Freire's work, he published "Paulo Freire: philosophical Biography" (Bloomsbury, 2021).

Ceane Andrade Simões is Professor of Pedagogy at the Amazonas State University. Additionally, she is member of the Study and Research Group on Public Policies in Education and the Study and Research Group on Theories, Epistemologies and Methods of Education at the Federal University of Pará.

Viktoria Vanek has a bachelor degree in Environmental Education at the "University College for Agrarian and Environmental Education" (HAUP) and has recently received her master degree in development studies at the University of Vienna. She works for Klimabündnis Niederösterreich (Climate Alliance Austria), where she is responsible for education and municipalities.
